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PREAMBLE

This document lays out the Rules and Regulations of the Ingwenyama MVA Cup (*herein after called the Rules*)

The abovementioned tournament shall be managed and administered by the Ingwenyama MVA Cup Management Committee, herein referred to as the MC in accordance with the Rules contained herein. The MC shall be as appointed by the Board of the Cup and any four members shall form a quorum in a meeting organised for the Management Committee.

The Secretariat of the MC shall be at the PLS Offices at Sigwaca House, PLS Offices Ground Floor, Mbabane; all notices/correspondence must be served to the MC on this location.

The MC and participating clubs in this tournament shall be deemed to have given their assent to these rules and to have undertaken to abide by them.

DEFINITIONS

All terms and phrases used in these rules will have the meaning defined in the constitution and rules of the League unless appears otherwise from the context.

1. The “*League*” is the Regional Super League or the National Leagues that conduct their affairs under the name and style of the Regional Football Associations or the Premier League of Swaziland (PLS) respectively.
2. The “*competition*” means the Ingwenyama MVA Cup.
3. The “*competition sponsor*” means Swaziland Motor Vehicle Accidents Fund (MVA).
4. “*Perimeter board*” is a pitch-side advertising hoarding placed at ground level around the perimeter of the pitch within the perimeter fence.
5. “*Secondary advertising*” is all stadium advertising other than the perimeter boards including but not limited to advertising or signs wherever positioned, A-frames , cam carpets (*advertising on the ground itself whether painted or physical*), flags, banners, inflatable branded vehicles or virtual advertising.
6. “*MC Representative*”: an official allotted and entitled by the MC for the devotions of the administration of the competition matches at the match venue or stadium, who shall also have the accountability of generating a report for the MC with respect to the organizational issues around the match, where applicable in terms of the rules and regulations of the competition.
7. “*IFAB*”: International Football Association Board; being the body authorized to develop, amend and prescribe the Laws of the Game, which govern the constitutive practice of football matches.
8. **A Match Commissioner / Match Official:** The person appointed to have sole authority for ensuring that a match is officiated according to the rules laid down in this document who is responsible for preparing a report of the match and to forward same to the relevant authorities in terms of these rules.
9. **Official:** Any member of the Match Supervisors or Competitions Committee of the Regional League **OR** Any person designated by the Regional Executive Committee (REC) to act in its capacity for match supervision e.g. a match commissioner, match supervisor, stadium representative, etc. **OR** Any member of the REC, the Regional Football Association (RFA) Office and its Standing and/or Adhoc committees.

10. **Defaulter:** A player who is not eligible to play in a particular game for any reason such as;

- a) suspension, expulsion, improper registration, double registration, or
- b) registered with more than one football club,
- c) unregistered,
- d) Declared ineligible in accordance with the regulations in force, etc.
- e) Any player as defined, shall be considered a defaulter if his name appears on the team list presented to the match officials at checking point for that particular game OR shall be considered a defaulter if he has played in the game in question.

11. **Player:** any football player licensed by an association.

12. **Unsporting Behaviour and Misconduct:**

- a) An improper registration of a player(s), double registration, and fielding of a defaulter; **OR**
- b) Invading the field of play, throwing of any object(s) into the field of play or its surrounding or unto persons thus assaulting or attempting to assault, use of threatening words, and physical manhandling with intent to assault or to cause bodily harm; **OR**
- c) Uttering abusive or obscene or derogatory words, spitting or emission of saliva onto a person or directed towards a person, use of provocative or insulting hand gestures/signals, and includes any incitement, conspiracy or attempt to engage in an act to bring football into disrepute; **OR**
- d) Failure by the football club(s) to control their official(s) or player(s) or supporter(s) or fan(s); **OR**
- e) Disregard of the Statutes of the RFA and rules governing this competition. It also includes disobedience of instruction by; the RFA Official; Match Commissioner or Referee or the Stadium Representative.

13. **FIFA:** Federation Internationale de Football Association

14. **NFAS:** National Football Association of Swaziland

15. **IFAB:** International Football Association Board

16. **DC:** The Protest and Disciplinary Committee.

17. **RFA:** Regional Football Association

18. **REC:** Regional Executive Committee

19. **RSL:** Regional Super League

ARTICLE 1 Scope and Organization

1. These rules cover the Regional Associations Super Leagues Phase of the competition, as well as Regional Super Leagues Champion of the competition.
2. This Regional Super Leagues Phase commences with the Preliminary Rounds for the Hhohho and Shiselweni Regional Super leagues to determine clubs to qualify into the 1st Round Stage; whilst those of the Lubombo and Manzini Super Leagues commence directly with the 1st Round Stage.
3. These rules must be read in the consulting with the; rules of the Super Leagues for the 2017/2018 Season.
4. Where any matter is not provided for in these rules, the rules and Statutes of the NFAS will apply.
5. Clubs that are eligible to participate in this phase of the competition are all Regional Super League clubs for the 2017/2018 football league season.
6. In the instances where a football club is unable to participate in the competition, the MC shall decide on the formula and /or regulation for the replacement.
7. The competition will be managed and administered by the Ingwenyama MVA Cup Management Committee (MC), herein referred to as the MC, which shall be a composition of appointed personnel by the Board of the Cup.
8. Any of the four (4) members shall form a quorum in a meeting organised for the MC.
9. Football Clubs and all parties concerned in this tournament shall abide by the rules of the League as well as these rules.

ARTICLE 2: Trophies and Awards

1. The winning Regional Super League Football club of the competition will be presented with the Regional Super Leagues Champions Trophy which shall remain the property of the MC.
2. Where possible; as may be decided by the organizers and sponsors of the competition; the winning club may be conferred with a replica trophy for its perpetual custody.
3. If a club wins the competition three (3) times it will be entitled to keep the trophy permanently and counting will begin from zero for the clubs.

ARTICLE 3: Participation

1. The competition shall be played by all Regional Super League Clubs who registered and qualify to play in the 2017/2018 Regional Super League season. This is subject to decisions and directives of the NFAS regarding unforeseen circumstances in football under its auspices.
2. This competition shall be played in a knock out format (*Preliminary Round to 4th Round*). Each of these rounds will be played regionally i.e. Regional Super League Football Clubs belonging to the same region will play together to produce a winner that will qualify to the 5th Round; where they will be joined by the National First Division League Clubs; the Premier League Clubs and two teams that would have qualified after a regional runners-up playoffs (*i.e. winners of regional runners-ups playoffs*). *The MC shall draw special regulations for the runners-up playoff phase.*
3. This Regional Super Leagues Phase of the competition commences with the Preliminary Rounds for the Hhohho and Shiselweni Regional Super leagues, to determine teams to qualify into the 1st Round Stage with 16 teams; whilst those of the Lubombo and Manzini Super Leagues commence directly with the 1st Round Stage as their Regional Super Leagues are at 16 teams each already. *The MC shall decide on the draw and regulations of the preliminary stage, taking into account specific regional super leagues status quos.*
4. The MC shall prepare a schedule of fixtures for the matches to be played, giving the date and time of each match at least two (2) days before the date of the fixture.
5. The MC may in certain circumstances change or reschedule the fixture. Clubs affected by these changes shall be informed in writing, electronically or telephonically through any designated member. This shall be done at least one (1) day before the date of the match.
6. It shall be the duty and sole responsibility of all teams to collect their schedule of fixtures. Failure to collect a fixture shall not exonerate a club or team from sanction in the case it arrives late or fails to honour a match.
7. The Winner of each Regional Association at the regional phase of the competition having qualified for the National Phase will also qualify for Semi Finals to determine the Regional Super Leagues Champions. This shall also be a knockout tournament that will proceed to the Finals to determine the Regional Super Leagues Champions. *The MC shall draw special regulations for this part.*
8. The MC and participating regional super leagues football clubs shall strictly adhere to the schedule of fixtures of the matches. No variations from the fixtures shall be allowed except in unforeseen extra-ordinary circumstances as may be determined by the MC. Unforeseen and/or extra-ordinary circumstances shall be determined by majority vote of the MC in case of any dispute.

ARTICLE 4: Players Registration

1. All clubs shall use their currently players; registered in terms of the prevailing regulations for the status and transfer of players as promulgated by the NFAS.
2. A player shall not be eligible to play for more than one club in this competition.

ARTICLE 5: Starting Time

1. Each club must arrive at the match venue ninety (60) minutes before the scheduled start of the match. On arrival at the match venue; each club shall submit its team's start list to the match commissioner or designated official in his/her absence.
 - a) Each club shall report at the card point seventy (50) minutes before the scheduled start of the match.
 - b) The card checking point shall be the dressing rooms of the stadium where the match is played or any other designated area for that purpose as directed by the match officials.
 - c) Failure to report as in (1) (a) above, a club shall be summarily fined an amount of E300.00 by the MC.
2. Between the scheduled kick-off time and Fifteen minutes after the scheduled start of the match, a club fails to report for card checking, the offending club shall be summarily fined (by the MC) an amount of E300.00.
3. If Fifteen (15) minutes after the scheduled start of the match, a club fails to report for checking, the game shall be called off, wherein the defaulting club shall lose the game to the opposing club. The offending club shall be deemed to have caused the abandonment of the game, and dealt with in accordance with Article 4 (6); unless the match commissioner or designated official in charge, in case of his/her absence, rules that the game proceed if he is satisfied with the club's explanation for being late. In event that the game proceeds, the offending club shall be summarily fined (by the MC) an amount of E1, 000.00.
4. When taking the field of play, a club shall use the official entrance as guided by the match officials and/or MC representative. A club that contravenes this rule shall be subject a summary fine and liable to payment of a fine not exceeding E300.00.
5. The report of the referee officiating the match shall be conclusive proof as to when a club reported at the card checking point.
6. A club that abandons or causes the abandonment of a match, or refuses to take the field of play shall lose the match to the opposing club, and be further subjected to a disciplinary action by the Disciplinary and Protest Committee and liable to a fine not less than E2,000.00.

7. The referee's report or that of the Match Commissioner shall provide conclusive proof as to which club abandoned or caused abandonment.

ARTICLE 6: Match Officials and Play

1. The referees committee shall appoint the match officials to officiate in a match.
2. In the event of the non- availability of the Match Commissioner to discharge such a function, the Referee of the match in question, shall facilitate.
3. The match officials of each match shall arrive at the field of play ninety (90) minutes before the scheduled start of the match and if he fails, he shall be subjected to disciplinary action in terms of the Referees Code of Conduct.
4. Any referee who takes the field of play, one to fifteen minutes after the scheduled start of the match shall be subject to disciplinary action in terms of the Referees Code of Conduct.
5. If at the scheduled start time of the match, all Referees are not present, the Match Commissioner or League Official, in the case where the provisions of Article 5 (2) have failed, shall appoint substitutes.
6. The defaulting referees shall be subject to disciplinary action in terms of the Referees Code of Conduct.
7. The report of the Match Commissioner and/or League representative, where applicable in terms of Article 5 (5) of these rules, at the game shall be conclusive proof as to when a Referee took the field of play.
8. Before the commencement of each match; the Match Commissioner, the Fourth (4th) official and the captains of both clubs shall check the players against their identity cards and team lists.
9. After a completion of the card checking formalities, the Match Commissioner and the Referees shall formally lead the two clubs into the field of play. It shall be an offence for a club to refuse to follow Match Official's instruction. Any club that refuses to follow the referees' instruction shall be summarily fined an amount not exceeding E1, 000.00.
10. The Match Commissioner or Referees shall allow and lead teams to return into field of play during half time of the match. It shall be an offence for a team to return into the field of play without the referee's or match commissioner's permission and the club shall be summarily fined E300.00. The club shall enter the field of play to their own half that the team will defend during the second half of the game.

11. The clubs shall pay referees fees in accordance with the Rules of the Regional Super leagues under which they play.
12. Immediately after the end of each match the referee shall write a report of the match, giving as much details as possible all occurrences before, during and after the match, such as:-
 - (a) When the club took the field of play.
 - (b) Misconduct of players leading to the caution or expulsion of such players.
 - (c) Unsporting behaviour of the officials, member, supporter and/or fans.
 - (d) Number of goals scored by each club as well as the names of players who scored.
 - (e) Cards (both yellow and red) issued to any player or official.
 - (f) The number of substitutes introduced by each club.
 - (g) Any other incident, which in his/her opinion is worth reporting.
 - (h) Any protest or objections by a club.
13. The Referee shall compile his/her report and hand it over to the MC Representative within 24 hours after the match at which he/she was officiating.
14. The Referee shall conduct a match in accordance with the Laws of the Game and his/her accession on points of facts connected with play shall be final.
15. No club shall refuse a match official that has been appointed by the Referees Committee to officiate at a match.
16. The Fourth official shall check the details of a substitute if such a player is introduced during the match.
17. Identity cards of players sent off the field and those alleged by the opposing clubs to be a defaulter (accompanied by protest) shall be retained by the Referee and handed over together with the match report to the MC Representative.
18. The Laws of the Game shall be those currently in force and as published by the IFAB.

ARTICLE 7: Determination of winners

1. The tournament shall be played as a knockout where the winners of each round shall proceed to the next round until the finals.
2. Each match shall last ninety (90) minutes i.e. two periods of forty-five (45) minutes with an interval as laid down in the FIFA Laws of the Game.
3. The following scenarios shall apply for the determination of a winner in each of the stages of the tournament:

(a) Preliminary Round to 4th Round Stage

- i. The Preliminary Round to 4th Round Stage matches shall be played as one knockout match where the winner shall be qualified for the next round.
- ii. In the case of a draw during the ninety minutes (*regular time*), the game shall proceed to penalty shoot-outs in terms of the Laws of the Game, and where applicable, sudden death penalties.

(b) National Regional Super Leagues Champions Determination Tournament Phase

- i. Semi-Finals Stage
 1. From the Semi Finals to the Finals; the matches shall be played as one knockout match where the winner shall be qualified for the next round.
 2. In the case of a draw during the ninety minutes (*regular time*), the game shall proceed to penalty shoot-outs in terms of the Laws of the Game, and where applicable, sudden death penalties.
- ii. The Finals stage
 1. The final match of this phase shall be played as one knockout match where the winner shall be declared the Champion of the Tournament (*in recognition of these rules and all applicable regulations*).
 2. In the case of a draw during the ninety minutes (*regular time*), the game shall continue to extra time of thirty (30) minutes i.e. fifteen (15) minutes each half.
 3. If it is a draw after the extra time, the game shall proceed to penalty shoot-outs in terms of the Laws of the Game, and where applicable, sudden death penalties.

(c) Runners-up Play-offs winners determination

- i. The Runners-up of each of the four (4) regions shall qualify to a Playoff Phase to determine the two (2) teams to join the four (4) regional winners to the National Phase of the competition.

- ii. The matches shall be played as one knockout match where the winner shall be qualified to the National Phase.
- iii. In the case of a draw during the ninety minutes (*regular time*), the game shall proceed to penalty shoot-outs in terms of the Laws of the Game, and where applicable, sudden death penalties.

ARTICLE 8: Playing Kit, Colours and Numbering

1. Each registered club shall have two sets of contrasting uniforms in its registered colours so as to effect change in case of colour clashes. A club that fails to bring an additional playing kit shall be summarily fined E200.00.
2. The visiting or away club shall be required to change uniform in case of colour clashes.
3. Failure by a visiting team to effect a colour change in its uniform within 15 minutes after the scheduled start of the match will result in the match being called off. The offending club shall if found guilty forfeit the match to the opposing club and be fined not less than E500.00.
4. Club officials should submit their club jerseys to the match officials so that the toss is conducted seventy (60) minutes before the scheduled kick-off time.
5. The players' kits shall bear numbers on their jerseys and Numbering shall be from 1 to 99.

ARTICLE 9: Serious Player/Club Misconduct

1. Players who are red carded will automatically be suspended from participating in one immediate official match after being sent-off and may further be liable to disciplinary action.
2. Yellow cards accumulated in various games of this tournament shall have no bearing on this tournament or any other tournament organised under the auspices of the NFAS, but a second yellow card in one game shall result in a red card.
3. A player who received a red card will automatically have his registration card withdrawn and forwarded to the office. The officiating referee shall be responsible to collect the player's registration card and submit it to the office with his match report.
4. A registration card, taken or confiscated by the office on account of 2 above, will only be returned after completion of the period of suspension to his club

upon payment of the retrieval fee of **E50.00** to the bank account and an authentic bank deposit slip is produced to the office.

5. It is the responsibility of each club, and not the office, to ensure that all players are eligible to play in this competition. Any club contravening this rule shall be prosecuted and if the team is found guilty, it shall be fined a minimum of five hundred (**E 500.00**) emalangeneni.
6. Notwithstanding any provision in these rules, the office reserves the right to charge any player and / or team that contravenes the rule regarding the playing of defaulting players, with the appropriate penalties/fines being invoked if the player and / or team is found guilty of the offence.
7. Any club fielding a suspended player shall lose the match in which the suspended player featured. Such a case shall be referred to the disciplinary committee and if found guilty may take disciplinary action against the club and the player concerned. If found guilty the club may be fined not less than E1,000.00, with the player liable to a possible suspension of not less than six (6) official matches.

ARTICLE 10: Other Unsporting Behaviour and Misconduct

1. Any club whose member(s), player(s), or fan(s) or officials engage in unsporting or violent behavior either before, during or after a match shall be guilty of misconduct and be liable to punishment.
2. Members, players, officials or fans include the following:
 - a) Any person (s) wearing articles of a colour of the offending club, e.g. scarf, badge, etc.
 - b) Any person who is seated at a stand or section of a stadium or ground, which is occupied by the followers of the offending club when the offence is committed.
 - c) Any person known by the match officials to be a supporter, official or fan of one of the clubs.
 - d) Any person who commits the offence in furtherance or support of the offending club's interest or favor.
 - e) Clubs are expected to post marshals to control their crowds. These marshals should police the proceedings and submit any offender to be the police for criminal prosecutions if they misbehave. Such incidents must be brought to the attention of the match official to serve as a mitigating factor in the event the said team is charged for misbehavior of its supporters.
 - f) No club is however, allowed to post guards /marshals at the dressing rooms and such conduct is liable for disciplinary action.
 - g) It shall be the duty of all officials, clubs and match officials to report to the office cases of misconduct likely to bring the game or administration thereof into disrepute.

3. The following shall be the punishment for those found to be guilty:

4. It shall be an offence for a club, as represented by its supporters, fans, officials and players, to use any substance which is supposed to command super natural powers. Any club convicted of this offence shall be fined an amount not exceeding E500.00.
5. The Referee's report or the Match Commissioner's/MC Representative Report shall provide conclusive proof regarding the use of substance as outlined in Article (10) (4) above. No substance of any kind shall be allowed on the floors of the dressing rooms. Any club that contravenes this rule shall be summarily fined the amount equivalent to E500.00 plus the cost of buying a substance to remove the stains caused by any substance used on the floor.

ARTICLE 11: Protest

1. Any protest regarding defaulters must be lodged with the referee before the start of the match or at the time the player is introduced into the field of play. The protest must be countersigned by both captains, and acknowledged by the referee, otherwise it shall be null and void. The referee shall take the player's card protested about and submit it to the office. The office shall photocopy the card and return it to the club for the next game.
2. Any other protest shall be lodged with the referee at the time of occurrence otherwise it shall be null and void.
3. Confirmation of a protest plus supporting evidence must reach the secretary of the office before 1000hrs the following working day, accompanied by a bank deposit slip of a non-refundable protest fee amounting to E1, 000.00. The protesting club must send a copy of confirmation to the opposing club.
4. Failure to confirm the protest within the stipulated time, the club shall be summarily fined a sum of One thousand (E1000.00) Emalangeni. Payable within twenty one (21) days.
5. The DC shall have power to consider and deal with the protest lodged by an individual club or MC and make necessary decisions.
6. Parties at a protest shall be afforded an opportunity to present an opportunity to present their case when the protest is being heard, and shall receive at least two working days' notice before the hearing.
7. A party summoned to attend a hearing before the DC shall receive a notice at least two working days before the hearing and shall have a representation of its choice.
8. The MC may subpoena any party under its jurisdiction and/or request the office to subpoena such a person to give evidence at the hearing.

9. The DC shall have power to sit over a case even if the other party is not represented, if the DC is satisfied that such party was informed of the date, time and venue of hearing. The decision of the DC shall be binding to all parties.
10. In the event that a party has been properly served with the notice to sit for a hearing and the matter has to be postponed due to the party's unavailability, the DC is empowered to order the said party to pay the costs related to the postponement of the case; that includes the sitting and travelling allowances of all concerned or in the event a club requests for postponement.
11. If a club is convicted and found to have used a defaulter by the Disciplinary Committee, they shall forfeit the game to the opposing club and further subjected to a fine not exceeding E1, 000.00.

ARTICLE 12: Appeals

For the purpose of this tournament, decisions of the Disciplinary Committee shall be final and binding, and therefore **no appeals shall be entertained**.

ARTICLE 13: Matters Not Provided For

Matters not provided for under these present Rules and Regulations shall be decided upon by the MC and its decision shall be final and binding to all clubs taking part in this tournament.

ARTICLE 14: General

In the event of a conflict between any Rules of this tournament and provision of the Constitution of the NFAS Statutes and applicable regulations, as they relate to the subject in question the NFAS Statutes shall take precedence.

ARTICLE 15: Publishing in the Press

1. The MC Chair/Spokesperson in consultation with the Board of the Cup and/or MVA shall be entitled to publish in the press (or any other media) reports or activities of the tournament.
2. Clubs and/or officials shall not publish or make statements that may bring the tournament, sponsors, the Regional Football Association, the PLS, the NFAS and all its sub-committees into disrepute. Any club that commits such offence shall be summarily fined an amount not less than E3, 000.00 by the MC.

ARTICLE 16: Breakdown of Prizes
